PARIS IN SPRING








From the moment you arrive, you discover a singular, discreet address facing Place des Vosges, part hotel, part art gallery. Nothing ostentatious: the materials, the details and the quietness naturally slow the pace. You settle in effortlessly. In the rooms and suites, the spirit of the place emerges through a subtle balance of heritage and contemporary lines. Every window opens onto Place des Vosges, inviting contemplation.

At Cour des Vosges, mornings unfold gently. Breakfast is served in the room: coffee, pastries and seasonal fruits prepare you for the day. To awaken the body, a private coach can guide you on an early-morning run through the still-quiet streets of the Marais. Breathing, moving through the streets before the bustle, rediscovering the neighbourhood at its most peaceful. Back at the hotel, the Roman-style pool prolongs the sense of calm. Water, silence, and a natural release that brings you back to what matters.







The rest is best explored on foot. In the Marais, walking reveals all: a visit to the Picasso or Car-navalet museums, a shopping pause at A.P.C., Sœur or Isabel Marant, a detour to Byredo or a niche perfumery, Diptyque, Le Labo, or Guerlain. Then, along the narrow streets, an art gallery appears at a corner, an old façade, a hidden courtyard glimpsed by chance.

The neighbourhood tells its story through de-tails, with no set itinerary. At lunchtime, a bistro terrace feels inevitable: the dish of the day, a glass of wine, and that unmistakable Parisian soundtrack of conversations and laughter.

The afternoon is spent at a different pace, cycling. From the Marais to the banks of the Seine, Paris reveals another side: historic façades, iconic bridges, lively streets. The city feels light, easy to cross. Cycling offers a rare sense of freedom, perfectly suited to spring.





The ride takes in the Palais-Royal gardens, then the Tuileries. Early blooms cast a gentle, suspended softness over the landscape. The path continues to the Jeu de Paume, a landmark of contemporary photography, where the exhibition Martin Parr, *Global Warning* awaits. A retrospective with sharp humour, ironically reflecting society and modern tourism. An ideal pause to see Paris differently.



By late afternoon, you return to Cour des Vosges. At the tea salon, a gourmet break awaits: pastries, a warm drink, and the last rays of the sun on the terrace. The interlude continues in your room with a bespoke massage, tailored to your needs and your mood of the moment.

As night falls, the idea is to keep that same tempo: a wine bar near Saint-Paul or Arts-et-Métiers, a few small plates to share, a glass... Then back to Cour des Vosges, to the quiet, letting Paris continue to live just outside the window.
